


African American Experience in Post-Civil War Washington

DC By the Book steps into the Civil War era through the novel *The Impeachment of Abraham Lincoln.* by Stephen L. Carter. Reading excerpts from the book, authors <u>C.R. Gibbs</u>, <u>Steve</u> <u>Dryden</u>, and culinary historian <u>Michael Twitty</u> will discuss the African American community in post-Civil War Washington. Led by moderator <u>Michon Boston</u>, panelists will discuss the changing dynamics of race, class, gender, and education.

The <u>DC By the Book</u> project explores the richness of non-Federal civic life in Washington and its character as a city, as brought to life by fiction.
